Incidence in US population is 1.3%, per the CDC, but higher in older patients. Other conditions that may occur include cardiovascular and respiratory conditions, cancer, arthritis, kidney disease, liver disease and severe migraines.

Symptoms include diarrhea, rectal bleeding, abdominal pain, fatigue and unintended weight loss. Even when the disease is inactive or dormant, patients are still monitored. If assessed and monitored, document in the assessment and plan, and report annually.

Crohn's disease has specific codes for location (small intestine, large intestine) and complications (rectal bleeding, intestinal obstruction, fistula, abscess and other complications).





Don't forget to add ostomy status codes, if the patient has an ostomy

- Use a specific code whenever possible
- When a condition has a code for a manifestation or complication, use it.
- If the code describes severity or stage, use it.
- Use combination codes when accurate "with bleeding," "with spasm."
- Code conditions annually.
- Follow this ICD-10 guideline:
- Code all documented conditions that coexist at the time of the encounter/visit, and require or affect patient care treatment or management. Do not code conditions that were previously treated and no longer exist.
- And, use from the ICD-10-CM guidelines, use rules in Section I & IV for outpatient/office coding.
